ORDINANCE NO. 1408

A ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE FOR THE CITY OF COLUMBUS, KANSAS, CHAPTER I, ARTICLE 4, SECTION 1-426, DEFINING THE ELECTION AND TERM OF THE CITY TREASURER.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS, KANSAS:

SECTION 1. That City Code 1999 and City Code 2014 at Chapter I, Article 4, Section 1-426 shall be amended to define the election and term of the City Treasurer.

SECTION 2. NEW SECTION 1-426: CITY TREASURER.

The City Treasurer shall:

- (a) Keep a full and accurate record of all money, received and paid out, in a ledger book provided by the governing body;
- (b) Publish a quarterly financial statement;
- (c) Perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Governing Body or the Kansas Statutes;
- (d) The City Treasurer shall be elected in November of each odd-numbered year, pursuant to Charter Ordinance Number 1377, and K.S.A.14-201, as a non-partisan elected official.**

SECTION 3. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

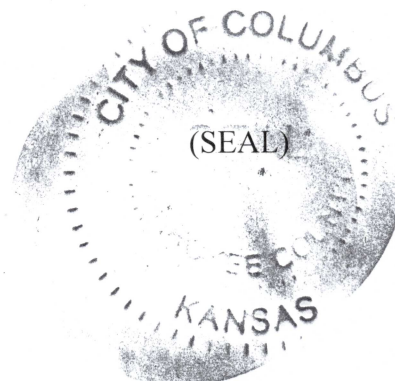
SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force upon passage and shall be published in the official City newspaper.

KSA 14-201. Elective and appointive officers; terms; compensation. Except as provided in K.S.A. 12-1028a, and amendments thereto, there shall be elected on the first Tuesday in April of each odd-numbered year a mayor, council members and **city treasurer**. Subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 12-16,128, and amendments thereto, the mayor shall appoint, by and with the consent of the council, a municipal judge of the municipal court, a city marshal-chief of police, city clerk, city attorney, and may appoint police officers and any other officers deemed necessary. Any officers appointed and confirmed shall hold an initial term of office of not to exceed one year and until their successors are appointed and qualified. Any officers who are reappointed shall hold their offices for a term of one year and until their successors are appointed and qualified. The council shall by ordinance specify the duties and compensation of the office holders, and by ordinance may abolish any office created by the council whenever deemed expedient.

The mayor, council members and city treasurer shall hold their offices for a term of two years.
