RESOLUTION NO. 267

A RESOLUTION FIXING A TIME AND PLACE AND PROVIDING FOR NOTICE OF A HEARING BEFORE THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS, KANSAS, AT WHICH TIME THE OWNERS, THEIR AGENT, LIENHOLDERS OF RECORD AND OCCUPANTS OF A BUILDING OR OTHER STRUCTURE LOCATED AS FOLLOWS:

The North Thirty (30) feet of Lot Thirteen (13), and all of Lot Fourteen (14), in Block Thirty-four (34), Town of Columbus, sometimes referred to as Original Plat Town of Columbus, according to the recorded plat thereof;

IN SAID CITY MAY APPEAR AND SHOW CAUSE WHY SUCH STRUCTURE SHOULD NOT BE CONDEMNED AND ORDERED REPAIRED OR DEMOLISHED AS A DANGEROUS OR UNSAFE STRUCTURE.

WHEREAS, the enforcing Officer of the City of Columbus, Kansas, on September 18, 2000, did file with the Governing Body of said City, a statement in writing that a certain structure, hereinafter described, is unsafe and /or dangerous.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS, KANSAS:

That a hearing will be held on November 6, 2000, before the Governing Body of the City at 7 o'clock P.M., in the City Hall at which time the owners, their agent, any lienholders of record and any occupant of the building located as follows:

The North Thirty (30) feet of Lot Thirteen (13), and all of Lot Fourteen (14), in Block Thirty-four (34), Town of Columbus, sometimes referred to as Original Plat Town of Columbus, according to the recorded plat thereof;

in said City, may appear and show cause why such structure should not be condemned and ordered repaired or demolished as a dangerous or unsafe structure.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk shall cause this Resolution to be published and shall give notice of the aforesaid hearing in manner provided by law.
