RESOLUTION NO. 33/

A resolution by the City of Columbus, Kansas, recognizing the establishment of the Columbus Accessibility Advisory Committee; approving the first draft of the Accessibility Advisory Committee's Transition Plan; and designating Jim Burton as the ADA Coordinator for the City of Columbus.

WHEREAS, the Columbus Accessibility Advisory Committee was established in October, 2005, and with the addition of Ed Reynolds, appointed in April, 2006, now consists of the following members: Jim Burton, Chairman; Lee Cossairt; Larry Dunn; Robert Jarman; Doug Mogle; Cindy Neely; Ed Reynolds; Larry Reynolds; Muriel Robinett-Louise.

WHEREAS, Jim Burton, chairman of the Accessibility Advisory Committee was authorized to present the Committee's Transition Plan draft during the informal mediation session pertaining to United States District Court case No. 05-1096 JTM, SKIL, et. al., vs. City of Columbus, Kansas, between David Calvert, attorney for Plaintiff, and Ed Keeley, attorney for Defendant, held Wednesday, March 22, 2006.

WHEREAS, Jim Burton is appointed as the ADA Coordinator for the City of Columbus, and his responsibilities include: plan and coordinate the City's overall compliance with the ADA; investigate grievances; oversee the preparation and implementation of the transition plan; and ensure program access.

WHEREAS, the Accessibility Advisory Committee shall meet to revise the Draft Transition Plan in accordance with the terms of the agreement reached by the parties during the mediation meeting on March 22, 2006.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Governing Body of the City of Columbus Kansas, that the ADA Coordinator and the Accessibility Advisory Committee shall revise the Transition Plan pursuant to the agreement made between the City of Columbus and the Plaintiff and Plaintiff's attorney.
