Items must be placed at curb side or in alley, separated from your regular garbage, on designated days as City Crews will NOT come back to pick up items. Divide items into like piles; wood, furniture, metal, etc. If not separated, items will not be picked up. Limbs may be taken to the Columbus Animal Shelter at 315 W. Cedar Street. **Ordinance No. 1184** prohibits anyone from going through and/or taking items set out for Fall Cleanup.

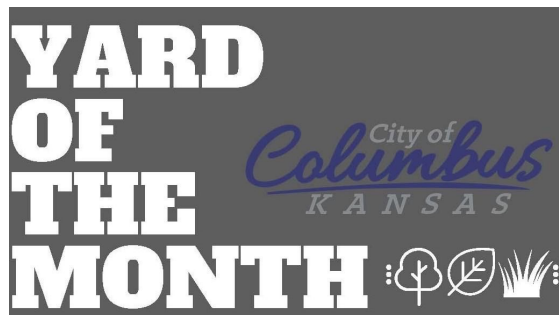
